# THE ARTIFICIAL TIME WARP WHEEL

*The Twelve Areas, at a Glance*

## What This Diagram Shows

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*Eleven ringed places, and one at the centre that all of them answer to.*

This Wheel is a companion piece to *Planetary Time Warp Architecture, Book I* — specifically to Part Seven, “The Twelve Artificial Time Warp Area Tests” (Chapters 23–34), where each of these twelve Areas is registered against Giza with its own coordinates, longitude and latitude tests, and stated precision. The Wheel does not introduce new locations; it is a visual index into work the Thesis has already done.

The image was generated independently of that chapter-by-chapter register, so the eleven outer circles carry no place names of their own — they are impressionistic landscapes, not site photographs. What identifies them is structural: eleven circles surrounding one centre, in an unbroken ring, matches exactly the Thesis's own count of Area One through Area Eleven surrounding Area Twelve. The centre circle — a pyramid rising in gold light — is unmistakably Giza, the reference datum Chapter 42 names outright and the point every other Area's distance and bearing in this Thesis is measured from.

One outer circle removes any doubt about the sequence: circle 11, showing a robed figure at a grotto beside a waterfall with cathedral spires behind it, is a direct depiction of Lourdes — Area Eleven. That fixes the numbering running clockwise from the top (circle 1) around to circle 11, immediately to Giza's left.

The table below pairs each circle with its Area, its terrestrial control point and coordinates as registered in Book I, and a short note on how confidently the circle's imagery matches its Area. Most match by general landscape type — desert and lake for the Takla Makan–Lop Nor basin, coral atoll for Kwajalein, volcanic island for Hawai'i — rather than by depicting the exact terrain. Lourdes alone is a specific, confident likeness.

# The Twelve Areas, Circle by Circle

**Reading the Wheel:** position corresponds to the circle's number in the image (1 at the top, running clockwise); Giza sits at the centre as Area Twelve and does not carry a position number of its own.
