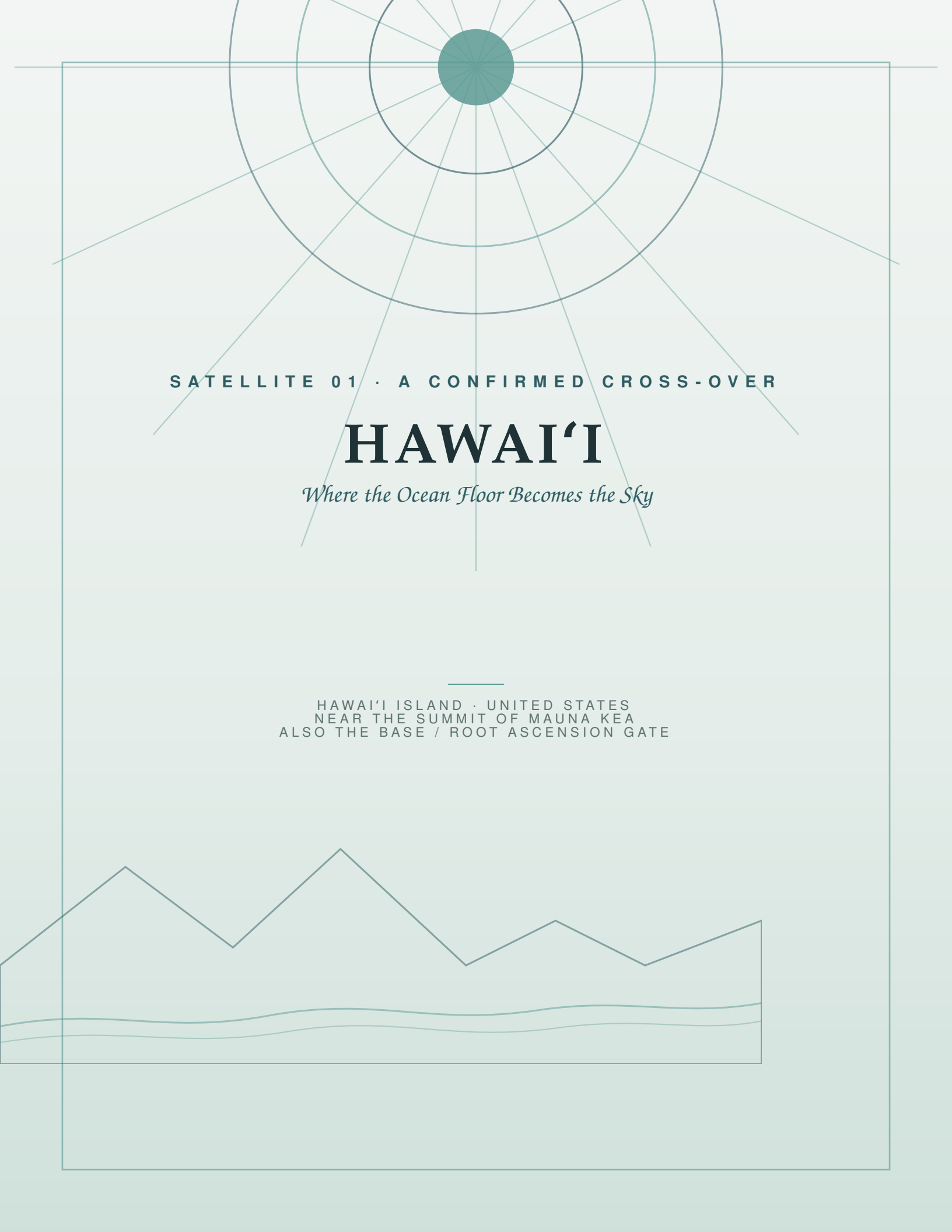




SATELLITE 01 · A CONFIRMED CROSS-OVER

Where the Ocean Floor Becomes the Sky

THE INVITATION

Come Stand Above the Clouds

Before you read a single figure, understand what your body will feel here: cold, thin, volcanic-black air at an elevation where the ocean that surrounds this island for a thousand miles in every direction simply disappears beneath a floor of cloud. You are standing on a tropical island. It will not feel like one.

Measured the honest way — from the true base on the ocean floor to the summit — this mountain outreaches Everest. Nothing about that fact needs decoration. Lava rock underfoot, an alpine lake holding snowmelt at over thirteen thousand feet, and a silence at the summit unlike anywhere else on the island chain, because almost nothing lives at this altitude to break it.

This is one of only three places in the whole field of twelve Satellites where two entirely separate systems — the Sun Disc's radiating Satellites, and the twelve Ascension Gates of the human chakra system — are confirmed to land on the very same ground. That is not decoration either. It is simply where the lines cross.

The Mountain Measured Twice

Mauna Kea rises 13,796 feet above sea level — but that is only the visible half of it. Measured from its true base on the floor of the Pacific, the mountain's full height passes 33,000 feet, taller than any peak measured only from a continental base, Everest included. It is a dormant volcano, its last eruption some four and a half thousand years past, its summit cold enough for snow most winters despite sitting at 19.8 degrees north latitude, deep in the tropics.

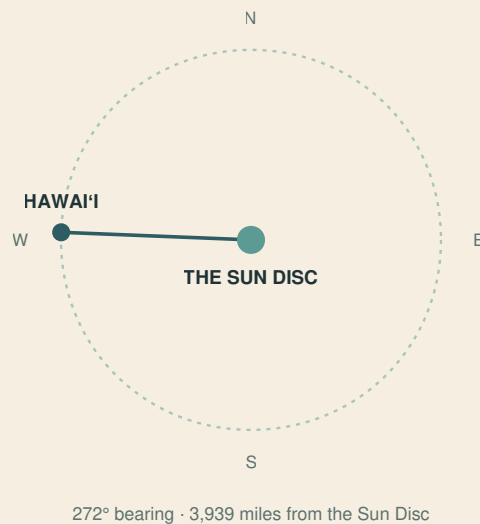
Near the summit, inside the Pu'u Waiau cinder cone, sits Lake Waiāu — a small alpine lake at roughly 13,020 feet, one of the highest bodies of water in the Pacific basin. Native Hawaiian families have long carried the piko, the umbilical cord of a newborn child, to this lake, entrusting it to the water as a way of tying that child's life to the land from its very first days.

The wider summit region holds hundreds of recorded archaeological sites — shrines, burial platforms, and ancient quarries where a uniquely dense, fine-grained basalt was mined and worked into tools traded across the entire island chain. People were not passing through this summit. They were coming to it, on purpose, for a very long time before anyone wrote any of it down.

THE ORIENTATION

A Line Back to the Source

From the Sun Disc's ground in Arkansas, this Satellite sits almost due west, and further away than any other point in the field of twelve — the outermost reach of the wheel.



This is one of Arkansas's three confirmed cross-overs, where a Satellite of the Sun Disc and one of the twelve Ascension Gates are named as the very same physical place — here, the Base or Root Gate. Two independently maintained systems, drawn up separately, meeting on one mountain.

WHAT THIS GROUND OFFERS

Beginning With What a Body Needs

WATER & BREATH

Thin, cold, unusually clean summit air; snowmelt gathering in Lake Waiāu; the full weight of the Pacific Ocean at the mountain's true base.

GROUND & SHELTER

Volcanic rock and cinder cone terrain — dramatic, exposed, and built by fire rather than by water or wind.

FOOD & PROVISION

The barren summit itself offers little; the fertile lower slopes and surrounding ocean have provisioned Hawaiian communities for well over a thousand years.

WORK & CRAFT

A documented basalt quarrying and toolmaking tradition, worked at the summit and traded across the entire island chain.

WHAT THIS GROUND OFFERS

Rising Toward What a Community Needs

KINSHIP & BELONGING

The piko tradition — a newborn's cord carried to Lake Waiāu — ties each new life in a family directly back to this specific water.

CHILDREN & LEARNING

A living lesson in scale: an island that looks small on any map is, measured honestly, taller than the tallest mountain on Earth.

CULTURE & CEREMONY

Hundreds of shrines, burial platforms, and quarry sites mark a summit set apart from ordinary ground for centuries before any outside visitor arrived.

REST & RENEWAL

A silence found nowhere else on the island — above the cloud layer, above nearly all other living sound.

VISION & CALLING

In Hawaiian cosmology this is the firstborn child of Sky Father Wākea and Earth Mother Papahānaumoku — the very first place named sacred, in the oldest telling of how these islands began.

The Firstborn Mountain

For Native Hawaiians, Mauna a Wākea — Mauna Kea — is held as the most sacred place in the islands: the firstborn child of the sky father Wākea and the earth mother Papahānaumoku, the point of origin from which the rest of the Hawaiian genealogy of creation descends. This is not a status assigned from outside. It is the mountain's own oldest name for itself.

That this same summit also carries the independent designation of the Base or Root Ascension Gate — confirmed as a genuine cross-over between the Gates and the Satellites, two systems named and mapped separately — is offered here plainly, as a structural fact rather than an argument. Two ways of reading this ground, arrived at by different roads, have landed in the same place.



A RECEIVING POINT, NOT A DESTINATION

None of this replaces standing on the ground itself. A Satellite is not a monument and not a holiday stop — it is a place already at work, quietly, carrying what the Sun Disc radiates outward into the land and the people around it.

Whatever draws you here — the mountain's true, ocean-floor height, the stillness above the clouds, or the fact that two separate maps of the sacred both point to this one summit — the invitation is the same one this whole field of Satellites extends.

FIELD NOTES

Specifications & Coordinates

Satellite 01 of the Arkansas Sun Disc · Hawai'i Island, United States — the summit region of Mauna Kea.

THE SUMMIT — MAUNA KEA

19.82° N, 155.47° W · Summit elevation 13,796 ft (4,207 m); >33,000 ft measured from the true ocean-floor base

Dormant shield volcano, Hawai'i Island; last eruption approx. 4,500 years ago. Lake Waiāu sits near 13,020 ft within the Pu'u Waiau cinder cone.

CROSS-OVER STATUS

One of three confirmed cross-overs between the Ascension Gates and the Sun Disc Satellites (with Denali and, in the broader Divine Plan mapping, one further point) — here, the Base/Root Ascension Gate.

REGIONAL ACCESS

Hilo and Kona, Hawai'i Island. Summit access via Saddle Road and the Mauna Kea Access Road; high-altitude conditions apply.

RELATION TO THE SUN DISC

Bearing 272.3° from Pinnacle Mountain, Arkansas · 3,939 miles (6,340 km)

Great-circle bearing and distance computed from the Sun Disc reference point (34.8414° N, 92.4858° W) to the coordinate given above.

Note: this document offers orientation, not survey. The coordinates above mark the named summit region, not a specific parcel boundary.
