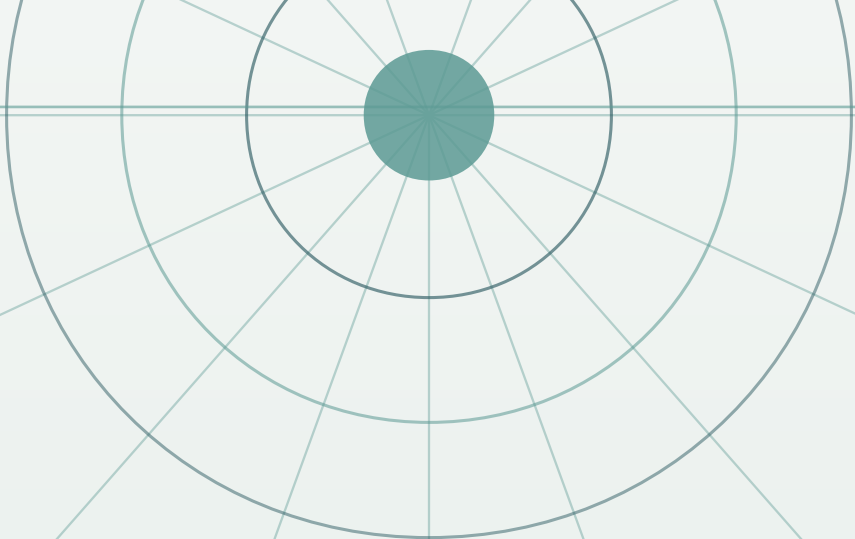

## THE INVITATION

# Come Stand Beneath the Tall One

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**L**ong before any surveyor's name reached this peak, the Koyukon people who have lived in its shadow for centuries called it simply Deenaalee — the tall one, the high one. Nothing about that name overstates the case. This is the highest ground in North America, and it does not share the skyline with anything else.

The scale is not gentle. From the surrounding plateau to the summit is one of the greatest vertical rises found anywhere on the continent — roughly eighteen thousand feet of granite, ice, and weather, standing nearly alone. Glaciers carve it by the century. Frost shatters its rock face by the season. The mountain is, quite literally, still being made.

This is also one of Arkansas's three confirmed cross-over points — a place where the twelve Satellites carrying the Sun Disc's radiation and the twelve Ascension Gates of the human chakra system, two systems mapped independently, are named as the very same ground: here, the Thunderbird Gate.

## THE LAND ITSELF

# Granite Pushed to the Sky

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Denali's summit stands 20,310 feet above sea level, the highest point in North America. The mountain is built of igneous granite, a pluton forced upward along the Denali Fault roughly sixty million years ago as tectonic plates ground against one another — then sculpted ever since by glaciers, frost-shatter, and some of the most intense alpine erosion on Earth.

For 2015, after decades in which the peak carried an imposed name honoring a president who had no connection to the mountain or the region, the United States federal government formally restored the name the Koyukon Athabascan people had used continuously for generations: Denali. It was not a renaming. It was a correction — the return of a name that had simply never stopped being true on the ground itself.

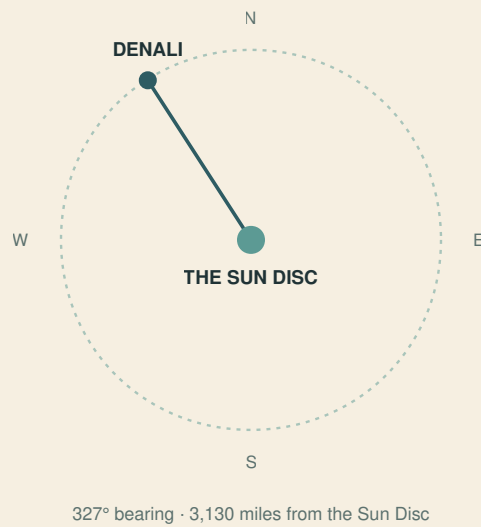
The surrounding national park protects six million acres of subarctic wilderness: glacier-fed rivers, caribou and wolf range, and light in summer that barely leaves the sky. Very little here has been arranged for comfort. That is, for many who come, the entire point.

## THE ORIENTATION

# A Line Back to the Source

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From the Sun Disc's ground in Arkansas, this Satellite sits to the north-northwest, deep into the subarctic — the second-most distant point in the whole field of twelve.



Denali is the second of Arkansas's three confirmed cross-overs — named independently as the Thunderbird Ascension Gate, the same ground carrying a role in both the Gates and the Satellites systems.

WHAT THIS GROUND OFFERS

# Beginning With What a Body Needs

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## **WATER & BREATH**

Glacier-fed rivers running the length of the range, and air with almost nothing in it but itself.

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## **GROUND & SHELTER**

Solid granite bedrock, shaped continuously by ice and frost — young, active, still-forming ground.

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## **FOOD & PROVISION**

Caribou, salmon-bearing rivers, and a subarctic ecosystem that has provisioned the Koyukon and neighboring peoples for generations.

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## **WORK & CRAFT**

Trade routes threading the subarctic interior for centuries, connecting communities across enormous distance.

# Rising Toward What a Community Needs

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## KINSHIP & BELONGING

A name carried by one people, unbroken, for longer than any outside map of this mountain has existed.

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## CHILDREN & LEARNING

A living geology lesson in real time — glaciers, frost-shatter, and uplift, all still actively shaping the ground you can watch.

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## CULTURE & CEREMONY

The 2015 restoration of the name Denali itself stands as a teaching: that what a people call their own ground outlasts whatever else it gets called in between.

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## REST & RENEWAL

Near-endless summer light and a scale of silence that reorders what feels urgent.

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## VISION & CALLING

A summit visible, on a clear day, from well over a hundred miles away — the tall one, doing exactly what its name has always said it does.

## A Name That Never Left

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Deenaalee — the tall one — is not a title applied to this mountain from outside. It is the Koyukon Athabascan name for what the mountain already is, held and spoken continuously for far longer than any competing name survived. In a body of teaching that repeatedly asks a reader to recover, not invent, what a place already carries, Denali offers about as clean an example as exists anywhere on the continent.

That this same peak is independently named the Thunderbird Ascension Gate — confirmed as a cross-over with the Sun Disc's Satellite system — is offered here as it was for Hawai'i: two separately maintained maps of the sacred, arriving at the same mountain by different roads.



### A RECEIVING POINT, NOT A DESTINATION

None of this replaces standing on the ground itself. A Satellite is not a monument and not a holiday stop — it is a place already at work, quietly, carrying what the Sun Disc radiates outward into the land and the people around it.

Whatever draws you here — the honesty of a name that was simply given back, the scale of a mountain still building itself, or the second of Arkansas's three confirmed cross-overs — the invitation is the same one this whole field of Satellites extends.

## FIELD NOTES

# Specifications & Coordinates

Satellite 02 of the Arkansas Sun Disc · Denali National Park and Preserve, Alaska, United States.

### THE SUMMIT — DENALI

63.07° N, 151.01° W · Elevation 20,310 ft (6,190 m)

Highest peak in North America; igneous granite pluton uplifted along the Denali Fault approx. 60 million years ago. Vertical relief above the surrounding plateau approx. 18,000 ft.

### CROSS-OVER STATUS

Second of the three confirmed cross-overs between the Ascension Gates and the Sun Disc Satellites — here, the Thunderbird Ascension Gate.

### REGIONAL ACCESS

Denali National Park and Preserve, central Alaska; nearest major access via the town of Healy and the Parks Highway.

### RELATION TO THE SUN DISC

Bearing 327.1° from Pinnacle Mountain, Arkansas · 3,130 miles (5,037 km)

Great-circle bearing and distance computed from the Sun Disc reference point (34.8414° N, 92.4858° W) to the coordinate given above.

*Note: this document offers orientation, not survey. The coordinates above mark the named summit, not a specific parcel boundary.*
