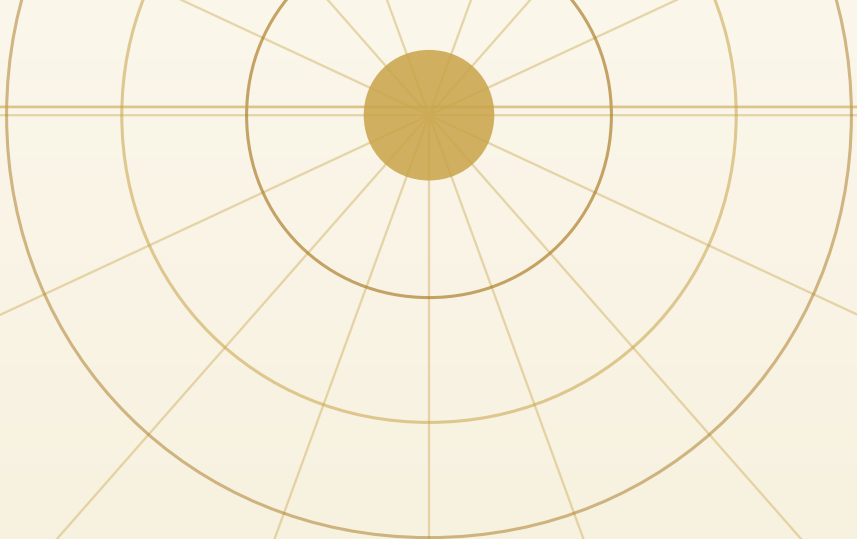




AREA IX OF ELEVEN · THE TIGHTEST NON-CLOSURE RESULT IN THE REGISTER

NOVA SCOTIA TO BERMUDA

Open Atlantic Water Between Two Coastlines, the Tightest Non-Closure Result in the Whole Register

THE REGISTRATION

A Result That Speaks for Itself

Area Nine spans open Atlantic water from Nova Scotia's rocky coastline down to Bermuda's coral reefs — a stretch of ocean better known, in other contexts, as part of the loosely-drawn “Bermuda Triangle.” Book I makes no claim about that folklore; it registers two government-sourced terrestrial controls, one at each end of the corridor, and tests each independently against Giza.

Of the two, Bermuda returns the tightest longitude residual of any non-closure control anywhere in the twelve-Area register — a result the Thesis flags on its own terms as the most exact eastward alignment found outside Giza itself.

That closeness is reported without turning Bermuda into proof of cause, and without borrowing the weight of a folklore association it does not need. The number is offered on its own evidential merits.

THE LAND ITSELF

Rocky Coast to Coral Reef

Nova Scotia's coastline is granite and glacial till, fog-bound harbours and a long history of shipbuilding and fishing along the North Atlantic's edge. Bermuda, roughly six hundred miles further out into open ocean, is a volcanic archipelago capped in limestone and fringed by coral reef, a very different geology at the corridor's far end.

Between them lies open water, part of the loosely-defined region popular culture calls the Bermuda Triangle — a name this document does not adopt or lean on. The corridor is tested as ordinary geography: two coastlines, a stretch of ocean, and a measured relationship to a datum point in Egypt.

Both government-sourced controls — an official Nova Scotia provincial feature and a Bermuda government reference point — are drawn from public record rather than any coordinate associated with maritime folklore.

THE ORIENTATION

A Line Drawn From Giza

Nova Scotia's control sits northwest of Giza at 4,985 miles (8,022 km), bearing 312.11°; Bermuda's control sits at 5,464 miles (8,794 km), bearing 301.07°.



The two bearings diverge more than at most other corridor Areas, reflecting the genuine geographic spread between a continental coastline and an isolated mid-ocean archipelago six hundred miles further out.

THE MEASURED REGISTER

What the Numbers Establish

SOURCE RECORD

Key 215 identifies this Area as Nova Scotia to Bermuda, registered as a corridor with two independently tested government-sourced controls.

COORDINATE SELECTION & PROVENANCE

Source precision: named. Map placement: field/corridor. The Nova Scotia control (45.00°N, 63.00°W) is an official provincial feature; the Bermuda control (32.31°N, 64.75°W) is a government reference point.

THE LONGITUDE TEST

Nova Scotia's eastward longitude test returns a signed residual of -2.960 arcminutes. Bermuda's returns -0.030 arcminutes — the closest six-minute-line result of any control in the study outside Giza's own necessary closure.

THE LATITUDE DIAGNOSTIC

Under the declared modern-Giza latitude phase, the 7.5' test returns $+1.439$ miles at Nova Scotia and -3.200 miles at Bermuda.

RESEARCH FINDING & EVIDENTIAL LIMIT

Bermuda's residual is the tightest non-closure result anywhere in the register, a genuinely notable finding reported on its own terms. It establishes a precise terrestrial registration; it does not, by itself, identify any field's complete extent or operative centre, and no folklore association strengthens or explains the number.

THE WORK OF ALIGNMENT

What Continues After the Coordinate Is Set

THE NATURE OF THE FIELD

A corridor spanning open ocean is, by its nature, the least settled kind of field in this register — no land at all lies between most of the distance separating its two endpoints. The field here is best understood as the relationship between two coastlines across that water, not a location within it.

CONTINUAL ACTIVATION, NOT RESIDENCE

No settlement of any kind is implied by this registration, least of all across open water. The ongoing work is the same activation and attention carried at every Area in the Wheel, held here as attention to a relationship between two coastlines rather than to any single physical location.

THE RHYTHM OF RETURN

Given that most of this corridor is open ocean, the working observation applies with particular force: periodic attention to either coastal endpoint, where travel is possible, appears sufficient to sustain the activation in these early years.

WHO TENDS THIS WORK

As with every Area in this Wheel, the ongoing alignment across this corridor is carried as part of the Brotherhood of Light's wider custodianship, not a new task assigned to any individual seeker.

A Tight Number, Reported Without Embellishment

The popular association of this stretch of ocean with unexplained disappearances is widespread enough that it would have been easy to lean on it here. Book I does not. Bermuda's residual is reported as a geodetic result, evaluated against the same null-geometry expectations applied to every other control in the study, and nothing more is claimed for it.

That restraint is, in its own way, the more interesting choice. A genuinely tight number, offered without the extra weight of folklore, has to stand entirely on its own measurement — and Book I lets it do exactly that.



A REGISTRATION, NOT A RESIDENCE

None of this replaces the work of alignment itself. An Artificial Time Warp Area is not a settlement and not a shrine — it is a coordinate already at work, quietly, holding its place in a field that reaches further than any single visit could.

Whatever draws attention here — the tightest non-closure result in the whole register, or the discipline of reporting it without reaching for a more dramatic explanation than the measurement itself supports — the same invitation extends: let the number speak, and nothing else.

*Come see if the ground confirms it,
the way a measured line confirms itself—
not by being believed, but by being checked.*

Specifications & Coordinates

Area IX of the Artificial Time Warp Wheel · Nova Scotia, Canada, and Bermuda — the registered corridor for Nova Scotia to Bermuda.

ENDPOINT ONE — NOVA SCOTIA

45.0000° N, 63.0000° W · 4,985 miles (8,022 km) from Giza, bearing 312.11°

Source precision: Named, official provincial feature. Map placement: Corridor endpoint.

ENDPOINT TWO — BERMUDA

32.3100° N, 64.7500° W · 5,464 miles (8,794 km) from Giza, bearing 301.07°

Source precision: Named, government reference point. Map placement: Corridor endpoint. Signed longitude residual $-0.030'$ — the closest non-closure result in the study.

METHODOLOGICAL STATUS

Both controls are drawn from public government record. No folklore association with the wider region is adopted or relied upon in this registration.

RELATION TO GIZA

Bearing 312.1° from the Great Pyramid, Giza · 4,985 miles (8,022 km)

WGS84 geodesic bearing and distance computed from the Giza reference point (29.9792° N, 31.1342° E) to the control coordinate given above.

Note: this document offers registration, not survey. Both endpoint coordinates above are government-sourced controls; vertical extent, magnetic orientation and field boundary remain open research questions in Book I.
